## **ABOUT KHANYISA HIGH SCHOOL**

Khanyisa High School was started by the Catholic Church in 1994. The aim of starting this school was to provide quality education, based on sound Christian values, to children in and around Mthatha. By providing Christian education, the school assists in the development of the whole person of the child in an environment in which all members of the school community are challenged to live out the gospel values in the context of our rapidly transforming society. The school is managed by a Board of Trustees drawn from the Diocese of Mthatha and the School Governing Body. The School Governing Body comprises of representatives of parents and SMT members. The School Governing Body is answerable to the Board of Trustees which in turn is answerable to the Diocese of Mthatha concerning all administrative and financial matters of the school.

At Khanyisa High School we do not admit students on merit or by selection.

**Khanyisa High School is a Catholic Independent School where there will be extra lessons/classes and tests on Saturdays, afternoons and some holidays which are compulsory when teachers feel it is necessary.**

**There are limited seats in each grade available and the admission policy is first come first served.**

## **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

Application forms will be available from 26 July 2021 to 6 August 2021. Within 7 days after receiving the form it should be returned. When an application form is returned, a date for an interview will be given and on that day the parent/s and the student (in full school uniform of the current school) are expected to come for the interview. This is not for selection purposes but to get to know the student and his/her background better. If the student does not turn up for the interview, the school considers that the student is not interested to come to Khanyisa High School and his/her place will be given to those on the waiting list.

## THE SCHOOL OPERATION

Reporting time is 7:00 – 7:15. The gate will be closed at 7:25. Classes commence each day at 08:00 and end at 15:00 (14:00 on Fridays). Co-curricular activities and extra lessons will be conducted between 15:00 to 16:30 from Monday to Friday. Parents are requested to see that their children reach Khanyisa High School at the latest by 07:15. Late coming will not be condoned. In order to complete the syllabus on time and make time for revision, we may conduct extra lessons during weekends and holidays. These classes are compulsory.

In the light of the current Coronavirus pandemic which is affecting the whole world, the operation of the school has changed in order to comply with the requirements stipulated by the Department of Health in order to prevent the spread of the virus. Until Covid-19 disappears, the school operates as follows:

1. The school operates from Monday to Saturday and attendance is compulsory as per the given timetable.
2. There are two types of classes as the allocation of classes has to comply with the 1,5m distance between desks where learners do not share desks, these are **contact classes and video lessons sent per term per grade**. For grade 12's, learners come to school from Monday to Saturday. For grades 8 to 11, learners come to school twice for **contact classes or three times a week in WEEK 1 and two twice in WEEK 2**. Learners are grouped into two groups in alphabetical order, taking half of each class per day. Parents are urged to provide their children with the necessary gadgets (a smart phone / a tablet or a laptop) and data in order to be able to access the video lessons from their homes. Moreover, parents are expected to monitor that learner go through these video lessons as the topics taught there will not be repeated and there will be formal assessments based on it which will count towards the year mark.
3. Learners are expected to wear masks from the time they leave home, at school and on the way back to their homes. The school has designed colour coded masks for each day and these masks are available at the school tuckshop.
4. Each learner is required to provide the school with 2 x 500 ml sanitizer with an alcohol content of not less than 70%, 500 ml liquid soap and two rolls of hand towels at the beginning of each term. These items are available at the school tuckshop.
5. The school recently installed 46 wash basins practically in every classroom and other rooms used for teaching and learning and supplies liquid soap for learners to wash their hands after every break time before and/or after eating and use the hand towels to dry them.
6. Parents should as the school does motivate and educate their children about the prevention measures such as wearing a mask, keeping a social distance of 1,5m from, washing their hands with soap for at least 20 seconds and sanitising their hands often.

We are aware of the poor background in Mathematics for most of the students. To overcome this handicap, we are providing an intense course in grade 10 Mathematics covering the previous grade topics, for a week before opening of schools in January. This is extra work done by the teachers during the holidays.



At Khanyisa High School we have three computer labs with a total of 120 computers for students available. We teach Computer Literacy to all students in grades 8, 9 and 10. We have 24-hour internet service available for students.

## **THE FEE STRUCTURE**

The annual tuition fee for 2022 is **R12 000**. This amount can be paid in four instalments of **R 3000** each (**January, March, May and July**)

If the payment is complete before June 20<sup>th</sup>, a discount of **R 100** on the last instalment will take effect. No discount will be given for the money paid out of estates.

In addition to the tuition fees, every student at Khanyisa High School should pay registration fees, books and computer literacy fees. The school will provide all text books, note books, portfolios/files, calculators(once), and other handouts during the course of the year. At the end of the year, all text books should be returned and will remain the property of the school.

Before or on the day of the interview, you should pay **R 800** for registration. After the interview and before the 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2021, a book fee of **R 3400** or half of it (R1700) should be paid. If only half of the amount is paid by 31<sup>st</sup> October, the other half must be paid by 30 November 2021.

Please Note: The above **R 3400** is NOT part of the annual school tuition fees which is **R 12 000**.

Khanyisa High School tie, track suit, caps, scarves and skirts for girls are obtainable from the uniform room at the school.

Information regarding the school uniform, the rules and regulations will be given at the time of the interview. Since there are limited seats available, returning the application form within 7 days, coming for interview and payments on given dates should be taken seriously. If you miss any of the deadlines, then the place will be given to those on the waiting list.

## FEES TO BE PAID

### 1. Registration Fees: R800.00 (non-refundable)

The R800 should be paid before a date for an interview which will be communicated. Pay at the Nedbank and bring the deposit slip to the school. **This amount is not refundable**

### 2. Textbooks, notebooks, files, handouts, computer literacy, calculator (once off), class photo and students card etc is R 3400.00. This is not part of the 1<sup>st</sup> instalment of the tuition fees. The figures that have been used to calculate the R3400 are as of the July 2021 price list. Should there be any increase in the prices, we will ask you to pay the difference.

All the required textbooks, notebooks and files for CASS (Continuous Assessment) cost more than this amount. The school is charging only a third of the real cost of all this. All textbooks remain the property of the school therefore it must be returned at the end of the year. The school regularly buys new books and replaces the old ones. Students will be given textbooks in good condition and if they are lost or damaged they should be replaced by the student/parent through the school

For the above, parents can negotiate with the office for part payments. All payments should be made with surname and name of the student and student number. If you have any type of account with NEDBANK, please make an account transfer. This will save the school an average of R 20 per transaction.

1. Obtain an application form by paying R100 at the reception office.

3. Get an interview date (it is not an aptitude test)  
During the interview students should be dressed in their full school uniform of present school. One or both parent/guardians should accompany the student to the interview. Please do not send young relatives or helpers as some documents need to be signed by the parent/guardian.
4. Candidates will only be interviewed after an amount of R800 for registration has been paid. **This amount is not refundable.** No learner will be interviewed before proof of payment for registration has not been submitted. A date for the interview will be communicated once payment has been made.
5. Before or on the 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2021, the balance of R3400.00 for books, computer, etc, should be paid. If half of this amount is paid by 31<sup>st</sup> October, the other half must be paid by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2021. These amounts should be paid into the school account and the original deposit of the applicant's slip **MUST** be brought to school. Only after the school has received the deposit slip will place be secured.



We have very limited number of seats. Summary of the admission process:

- I. Hand in the application form within (7) days
- II. Come for the interview with parents/guardians
- III. Pay R800 before the interview and submit the deposit slip to school during the time of interview.
- IV. Pay R3400/ or half of it for books, computer etc, before the 31<sup>st</sup> October 2021and submit deposit slip.
- V. Pay R750 Sports Development Fee by 30 June 2022

## UNIFORM CODE

### BOYS

1. **Shoes:** Plain black, lace up school shoes. No suede, no patterns, only one shade of black. No buckled or slip in shoes allowed to be worn with the school uniform.
2. **Socks:** Ordinary grey school socks. Socks must be worn with shoes.
3. **Trousers:** Long grey trousers as obtainable for schools.
4. **Plain black belt.** Plain buckle not more than 4cm in height. No key rings, etc, may be attached to the belt.
5. **Shirts:** White button up, cotton or polyester. Plain white under shirts or school T-Shirts may be worn under the shirt.
6. **Tie:** A school tie must be worn with the white shirt on all school days.
7. **Jersey:** Navy blue V-neck with golden line. School track suite top may be worn with or without school jersey.
8. **Blazer:** Navy blue blazer with one fleet on the back. No double breasted.
9. **Hair:** No dyeing, peroxidizing or gel. Hair should not be over the ears or eyes. If it is shoulder length, it must be tied back with a navy or black band.
10. **Jewellery:** No earrings, studs, sleepers, facial rings or any visible jewellery is allowed when wearing school uniform.
11. **Hats:** Only school hats may be worn with the school uniform during winter.

### GIRLS

1. **Shoes:** Plain black, lace up or in step. Shoes must be polished. No high heels/platforms, only one shade of black. No buckled or slip-in shoes allowed to be worn with the school uniform.
2. **Socks:** In summer short white socks no shuffle socks or sheer stockings. In winter navy and gold socks or navy stockings maybe worn with school uniform.
3. **Skirts:** Navy blue, obtainable at the school and compulsory
4. **Shirts:** Plain white cotton or polyester button up.
5. **Tie:** The school tie should be worn with the white shirt.
6. **Jersey:** Navy blue V-neck with golden line obtainable at the school and it is compulsory. The school track suit top may be worn with or without a school jersey.
7. **Blazer:** Navy blue blazer.
8. **Hair:** No dyeing or peroxidizing or gel. Hair should not be over the ears or eyes. If it is shoulder length it must be tied back with a navy or black hair band

9. **Jewellery:** Plain gold or silver sleepers, or round studs may be worn but only one in each ear. No visible jewellery, facial rings maybe worn with the school uniform or school sport uniform/
10. **Make up:** No makeup or nail polishing is allowed when wearing Khanyisa High School uniform.
11. **Winter Uniform:** In winter months (May – July) girls may wear full school track suit with a white school T-shirt, no shirts and ties on Wednesdays only. When wearing the track suit, black takkies should be worn in the place of school black shoes. As part of matric privileges, grade 12s wear a school house colour T-shirt, tracksuit and a matric jacket on Fridays.

(All school clothing is available at school in the uniform shop).

**NB:** School tie, sports T-shirt, track suits, scarves and hats are available at the school shop. When school reopens books will be supplied to students in the class. **(It is compulsory for all learners to wear a school tie and have a house colour T-shirt).**
