KHANYISA High School was started by the Catholic Church in 1994. The aim of starting this school was to provide quality education, based on sound Christian values, to children in and around Mthatha. By providing Christian education, the school assists in the development of the whole person of the child in an environment in which all members of the school community are challenged to live out the gospel values in the context of our rapidly transforming society. The school is managed by a Board of Trustees drawn from the Diocese of Mthatha and the School Governing Body. The School Governing Body comprises of representatives of parents. The School Governing Body is answerable to the Board of Trustees which in turn is answerable to the Diocese of Mthatha concerning all administrative and financial matters of the school.

At Khanyisa we do not admit students on merit or by selection.

Khanyisa High School is a Catholic Independent School where there will be extra lessons/classes and tests on Saturdays, afternoons and some holidays which are compulsory when teachers feel necessary.

There are limited seats in each grade and the admission policy is first come first served!

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Application forms will be given out from 15 May 2023 to 31 August 2023. Within 7 days, the form should be returned. When an application form is returned, a date for interview will be given and on that day the parent/s and the student (in full school uniform of the current school) are expected to come for the interview. This is not for selection purposes but to get to know the student and his/her background better. If the student does not turn up for the interview, the school considers that that student is not interested to come to Khanyisa and his/her place will be given to those in the waiting list.

THE SCHOOL OPERATION

Reporting time is 7:00 am – 7:15am, the gate will be closed at 7:25am. Classes begin each day at 08h00 and end at 15h00 (14h00 on Fridays). Co-curricular activities and extra lessons will be conducted between 15h00 to 16h30 from Monday to Friday. Parents are requested to see that their children reach Khanyisa latest by 07h15. Late coming will not be condoned. In order to complete the syllabus on time and make time for revision, we may conduct extra lessons during weekends and holidays. These classes are compulsory.

In the light of the current Coronavirus pandemic which is affecting the whole world, the operation of the school has changed in order to comply with the requirements stipulated by the Department of Health in order to prevent the spread of the virus.

We are aware of the poor background in Mathematics for most of these students. To overcome this handicap, we are giving an intense course in grade 10 Mathematics covering the previous grade topics, for a week before opening of schools in January. This is extra work by the teachers during the holidays.

At Khanyisa we have three computer labs with a total of 120 computers for students are available. We teach computer literacy to all students in grades 8, 9 and 10. We have 24-hour internet service for students in the library.

THE FEE STRUCTURE

The annual fees for 2024 are **R 13 000**. This amount can be paid in four instalments of **R 3250** each (**January, March, May and July**).

If you complete the payment before June 20th, you will get a discount of **R100** on the last instalment. No discount given for the money paid out from estates.

On top of this school fees, every student at Khanyisa should pay registration fees, books and computer literacy fee. The school will provide all text books, note books, portfolios/files, calculators(once), and other handouts during the course of the year. At the end of the year, all text books should be returned and will remain the property of the school.

Before or on the day of the interview, you should pay **R1000** for registration. After the interview and before the 31st of October 2023, a book fee of **R3600** or half of it (R1800) should be paid. If only half of this month is paid by 31st October, the other half must be paid by 30 November 2023.

PLEASE NOTE: The above **R 3600** is NOT part of the annual school tuition fees which is **R13 000**.

Information regarding school uniform, rules and regulations will be given at the time of the interview. Since there are limited seats available, returning the application form within 7 days, coming for interview, payments on given dates should be taken seriously. If you miss any of the deadlines, then the place will be given to those in the waiting list.

FEES TO BE PAID

1. **Registration Fees : R1000.00 (non-refundable)**

The above R1000 should be paid before a date for the interview will be communicated. Pay at the bank and bring the deposit slip to the school. **This amount is not refundable**

2. **Textbooks, notebooks, files, handouts, computer literacy (grade 9), yearly magazine, calculator (once off), class photos and students card etc is R3600.00.** This is not part of the 1st instalment of tuition fees. The figures that have been used to calculate the R3600 are as of the April 2023 price list. Should there be any increase in the prices, we will ask you to pay the difference.

All the required textbooks, notebooks and files for CASS (Continuous Assessment) cost more than this amount. The school is charging only a third of the real cost of all this. All textbooks remain the property of the school so they must be returned at the end of the year. The school regularly buys new ones and replaces old ones. Students will be given textbooks in good condition and if they are lost or damaged they should be replaced by the student/parent through the school.

4. **Tuition Fees : R13 000.00 per year (excluding registration)**
 1st Instalment : R3 250.00 to be paid before 31st January
 2ndInstalment : R3 250.00 to be paid before 31st March
 3rdInstalment : R3 250.00 to be paid before 31st May
 4thinstalment : R3 250.00 to be paid before 31st July.

Parents who pay all fees by the 20th of June, except for payments made by estate funds, will be given a discount of R100.00

Parents, please note that the book fees and computer fees etc. is R3600. There should be no misunderstanding regarding this and the tuition fees.

For the above, parents can negotiate with the office for part payments. All payments should be made with surname and name of the student. If you have any type of account with NEDBANK, please make account transfer that will save the school an average of R20 per transaction.

Please bring or email the deposit slip/account transfer proof to the school to get an official receipt from the office. For any queries, contact reception office at 047 - 1500002

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

1. Obtain an application form by paying R100 at the reception office.
2. Return the form within 7 days with the following documents: -

3. Get an interview date (it is not an aptitude test). During the interview students should be dressed in their full school uniform of present school. One or both parent/guardian should accompany the student to the interview. Please do not send young relatives or helpers as some documents need to be signed by the parent/guardian.
4. Candidates will only be interviewed after an amount of R1000 for registration has been paid. **This amount is not refundable.** No learner will be interviewed before proof of payment for registration has not been submitted. A date for the interview will be communicated once payment has been made.
5. The payment of R3600.00 for books etc, should be made within 21 days after the interview. If half of this amount is paid by within 21 days after the interview, the other half must be paid by 31st October 2023. These amounts should be paid into the school account and the original deposit slip **MUST** be brought to school. Only after the school has received the deposit slip will your place be secured.

We have a very limited number of seats.

Summary of the admission process:

- I. Hand in the application form within (7) days*
- II. Come for the interview with parents/guardians*
- III. Pay R1000 before the interview and submit the deposit slip to school during the time of interview.*
- IV. Pay R3600/ or half of it for books and computer etc, before the 31st October 2023 latest by 30 November 2023 and submit the deposit slip.*
- V. Pay R750 Sports Development Fee by 30 June 2024.*

UNIFORM CODE

BOYS

1. **Shoes:** Plain black, lace up school shoes. No suede, no patterns, only one shade of black. No buckled or slip in shoes allowed to be worn with school uniform.
2. **Socks:** Ordinary grey school socks. Socks must be worn with shoes.
3. **Trousers:** Long grey trousers as obtainable for schools.
4. **Plain black belt.** Plain buckle not more than 4cm in height. No key rings, etc, may be attached to the belt.
5. **Shirts:** White button up, cotton or polyester. Plain white under shirts or school T-Shirts may be worn under the shirt.
6. **Tie:** School tie must be worn with the white shirt on all school days.
7. **Jersey:** Navy blue V-neck with golden line. School track suite top may be worn with or without school jersey.
8. **Blazer:** (optional) Navy blue blazer with one fleet on the back. No double breasted.
9. **Hair:** No dyeing, peroxiding or gel. Hair should not be over the ears or eyes. If it is shoulder length, it must be tied back with a navy or black band.
10. **Jewellery:** No earrings, studs, sleepers, facial rings or any visible jewellery is allowed when wearing school uniform.
11. **Hats:** Only school hats may be worn with the school uniform during winter.

GIRLS

1. **Shoes:** Plain black, lace up or in step. Shoes must be polished. No high heels/platforms, only one shade of black. No buckled or slip-in shoes allowed to be worn with school uniform.
2. **Socks:** In summer short white socks no shuffle socks or sheer stockings. In winter navy and gold socks or navy stockings maybe worn with school uniform.
3. **Skirts:** Navy blue, obtainable at the school and compulsory
4. **Shirts:** Plain white cotton or polyester button up.
5. **Tie:** The school tie should be worn with the white shirt.
6. **Jersey:** Navy blue V-neck with golden line obtainable at school and compulsory. School track suit top may be worn with or without school jersey.
7. **Blazer** (optional) Navy blue blazer.
8. **Hair:** No dyeing or peroxiding or gel. Hair should not be over the ears or eyes. If it is shoulder length it must be tied back with a navy or black hair band
9. **Jewellery:** Plain gold or silver sleepers, or round studs may be worn but only one in each ear. No visible jewellery, facial rings maybe worn with school uniform or school sport uniform/
10. **Make up:** No makeup or nail polishing is allowed when wearing school uniform.
11. **Winter Uniform:** In winter months (May – July) girls may wear full school track suit with a white school T-shirt, no shirts and ties only on Wednesdays. When wearing the track suit, black takkies should be worn in the place of school black shoes. As part of matric privileges, grade 12s wear a school house colour T-shirt, tracksuit and a matric jacket on Fridays.

NB: School tie, sports T-shirt, track suits, scarves and hats are available at the school shop. When school reopens books will be supplied to students in the class. **(It is compulsory for all learners to wear a school tie and have a house colour T-shirt).**

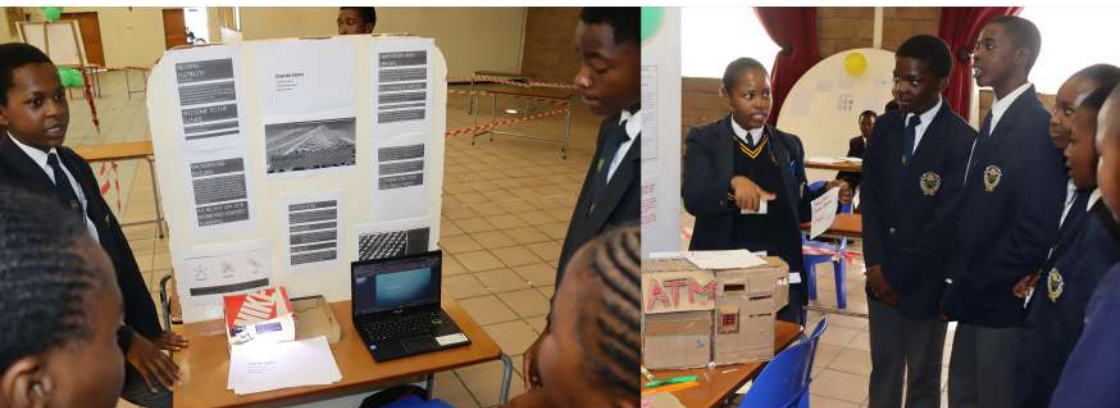

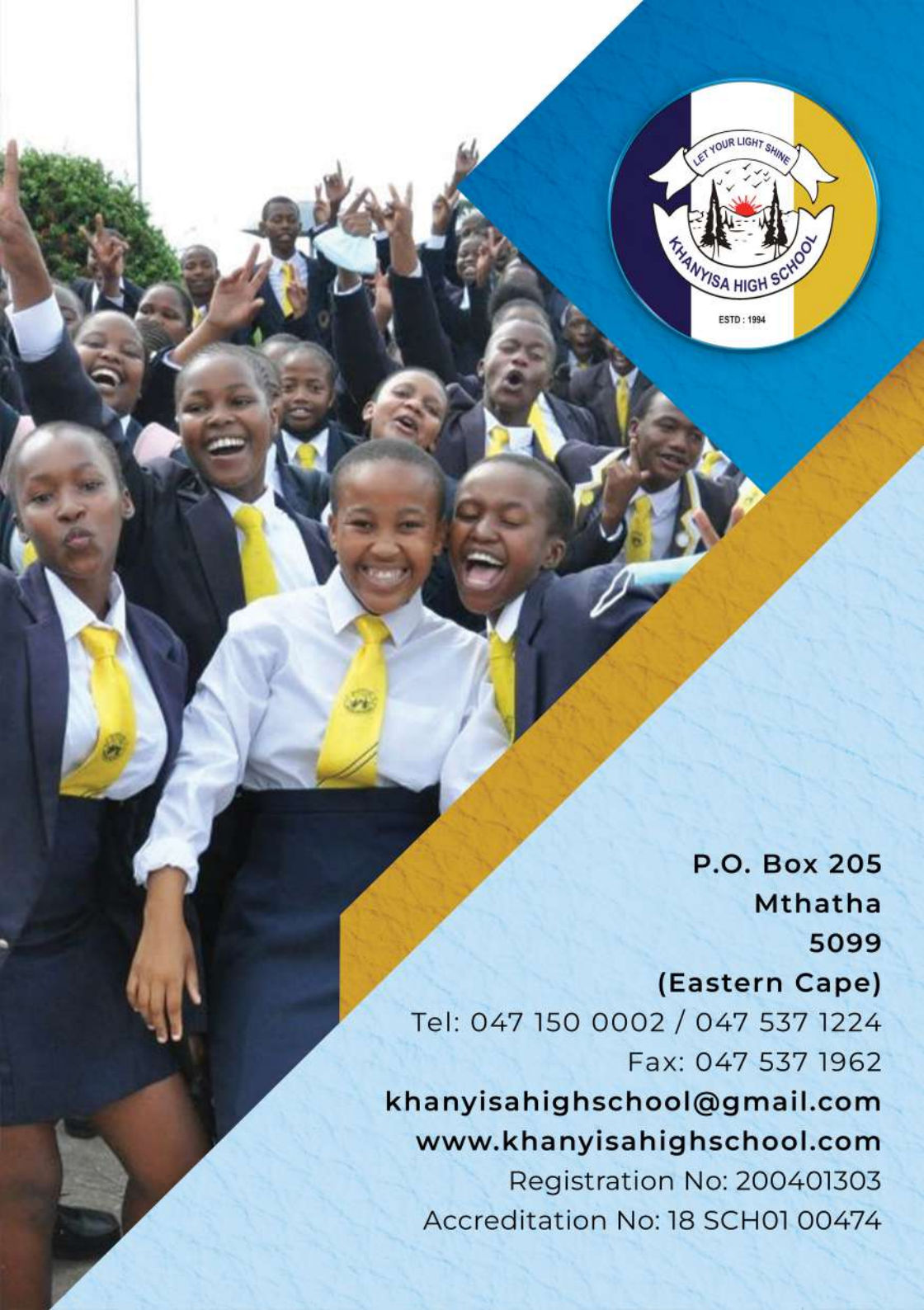
